



## Evidencing the Impact of Primary PE and Sports Premium

**The funding (£17,540) allocated has been provided to ensure impact against the following objective:**

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to **long lasting impact against the vision** (above) that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

It is expected that Oakfield will see an improvement against the following five key indicators:

1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. broader experiences of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. increased participation in competitive sport

# Swimming & Water Safety

Swimming features in the academy’s curriculum as we are able to use funding to support the cost of running this. We cover the entire costs associated with swimming to ensure all pupils are able to attend, though parents are responsible for ensuring all children have the appropriate clothing and kit to enable them to take part.

# Forest School

In order to extend our Forest School offering to more pupils so that they have further access to equipment and resources outside of their regular day-to-day experiences and to keep them active, we use part of the sports premium to fund 50% of the cost of this programme. This means that the whole school now has access to regular Forest School sessions throughout the year and thus view being active as part of their life at school.

The aim of purchasing the Real Legacy programme is to promote physical education in all learners and to develop staff confidence in teaching PE. The programme provides us with a web resource that aids delivery of engaging, challenging and high-quality teaching, regular contact with a provider who supports staff training, implementation of the programme and additional CPD, and a platform to engage learners at home to be physically active.
